Dear Mr Witcomb

I would like to express my views in support of HCA in light of the Competition Commission's recently published 'Provisional Decision on Remedies'.

I am a Consultant Neurosurgeon working at Harley Street at Queen's in Romford since it opened about [%] years ago. My private practice is also based in [%] hospitals.
