Dear Inquiry Manager,

I am a consultant Orthopaedic surgeon who works at one of London's Teaching Hospitals and Major Trauma Units. I would like to draw your attention to the outstanding level of care currently provided by London Bridge Hospital and my concern about the recommendations of the Competition Commission.

I have admitting rights to a number of private hospitals within London, but I have in fact effectively isolated my private practice solely to London Bridge Hospital.
