The student pilot was on a solo circuit consolidation exercise using runway 30 at Cardiff. The weather was fine with a surface wind of 230° to 250°/ 12 kt. As the pilot flared to land from a full flap powered approach the aircraft yawed to the right. The pilot applied corrective left rudder which remained applied as the aircraft touched down. The aircraft swerved to the left of the runway, overran and damaged a runway light before coming to rest on the grass.

The pilot then advised ATC that he would taxi the aircraft along the grass to the holding point. This area was not approved for manoeuvring and had a very uneven surface. On reaching the hold the pilot was asked by ATC whether he intended to shutdown or carry out a further take off. The pilot was not aware of the damage to the aircraft and elected to fly a further circuit. This was completed without incident.

Inspection of the aircraft later revealed not only damage to the landing gear but also considerable grass staining and a small chip from the propeller.

The pilot reported that the cause of the accident was due to his slow reaction in removing left rudder on touchdown and that his decision to carry out a further take off was unwise.
