Just before the flare following a normal approach, the aircraft pitched nose down and, before the pilot could recover, the mainwheels struck a trench located eight feet short of the runway threshold. The aircraft inverted but both occupants were able to escape uninjured. The pilot attributes the cause of the accident to windshear encountered at a late stage of the approach.
