The aircraft had landed at Halfpenny Green after a flight from Gloucestershire Airport, and was being taxied to park in the vicinity of the hangars. The hardstanding around the hangars was unusually congested with parked aircraft because the usual grass parking areas on the aerodrome were affected by waterlogging. The commander stated that as he taxied towards hangar 5, looking ahead to avoid parked aircraft, the outboard leading edge of the right wing came into contact with a small concrete building adjacent to the hardstanding. The building was described as being some two metres high, and located approximately one metre from the edge of the hardstanding. The commander commented that it was not observed prior to impact because its colour (natural concrete) blended in with the background.

Since this occurrence, the aerodrome operator has painted the building with white paint in order to improve its visibility.
