Following a normal approach the aircraft touched down on its main wheels on grass runway 25. When the nosewheel was lowered at a speed estimated by the pilot to have been about 40 kt, the aircraft encountered undulations on the runway which caused it to porpoise and become airborne again for a short distance. It returned to the runway surface nosewheel first and was then brought under control. The pilot reported that neither the porpoising nor the nosewheel touchdown seemed severe enough to have caused the damage to the aircraft.

Operators familiar with the runway are aware of a hump some 20 to 25 metres in from the touchdown zone. The aerodrome operator has plans to plough and reset the runway to overcome this problem.
