On returning from an uneventful flight to Le Touquet, the aircraft was making a full flap approach to runway 24. As the pilot was preparing to round out, the aircraft dropped suddenly and made a heavy contact with the runway, causing the left tyre to burst. The aircraft bounced into the air again, and subsequently landed nose wheel first, the propeller striking the ground in the process. The pilot then regained control, and taxied the aircraft clear of the runway. The wind at the time was reported as 290°, 10 to 15 kt, with gusts of 25 kt. The pilot attributes the event to a gust of wind.
