The pilot was taxiing the aircraft on grass at 5 mph with idle power (800 RPM) selected, from the refuelling pumps along a line of parked aircraft towards a nearby hangar. During the taxi manoeuvre the fuel transfer pump warning light illuminated. The pilot glanced inside the cockpit to identify the light and select the pump switch 'OFF'. Whilst his attention was momentarily diverted the aircraft turned to the left and collided with a parked Piper PA-28 Warrior. After the collision the pilot shut down the engine and vacated the aircraft without injury. The Spitfire came to rest with its wing above that of the PA-28.
