The aerodrome at Liverpool has two parts; the southern area includes the active runway, Passenger Terminal and General Aviation facility, while the northern area is devoted to maintenance and hangarage. The two areas are linked by a single taxiway. It was the established practice, after the completion of each days flying, for the local flying schools' aircraft to be taxied from the ramp on the southern side to the overnight hangarage on the northern side. On the evening of the accident, both G-BDNR and G-BIBW were being repositioned for overnight parking; on board the latter was a pilot who had just completed a check flight and his flying instructor.
