

The aircraft had taken off from Nottingham Tollerton Airport at 1625 hrs for some circuits and a local flight. Runway 21 was in use and there was a light south-westerly wind. After flying several circuits, the aircraft departed for the local area and returned at about 1700 hrs. to land on runway 21. During the landing roll, the left main landing gear slowly retracted. The aircraft departed the runway on the left, coming to rest on the grass.

Subsequent inspection of the aircraft showed that the threaded end fitting of the actuating rod assembly had broken (see diagram). This had allowed the mechanism to unlock and retract. Socata Service Bulletin No. 11 called for an inspection of this general area, including the threaded end fitting, at 25 hour intervals. At the time of the accident the aircraft had completed over 1700 hours. It it is likely that this fitting had been installed at original build.



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
