The pilot was undertaking his first flight on this type of aircraft. Having flown a normal circuit, he attempted to carry out a low go-around from a higher than normal approach speed. However, he inadvertently allowed the aircraft to touch down and bounce. A second heavy contact with the runway caused the landing gear to collapse and the aircraft came to a halt at the side of the runway after a ground slide of about 75 metres.
