The aircraft was on a flight from Leeds/Bradford Airport to the uncontrolled grass landing strip at Brands Hatch. The pilot reports that he checked the surface wind at London City Airport (using Thames Radar) and after arriving overhead Brands Hatch flew two go arounds in order to assess the actual wind and surface conditions. He decided to land on the south-easterly runway which has an available length of 600 metres.

The aircraft touched down approximately 150 m from the threshold, appeared to decelerate normally, and the pilot anticipated no problems. However at a speed of about 30 knots when the brakes were applied no further deceleration was felt. The pilot shut down the engine shortly before the aircraft ran into a bank along the airstrip boundary. All four occupants, who were wearing full upper torso restraint harness, vacated the aircraft without injury.

The south-easterly runway at Brands Hatch has a slight down slope and, at the time of the accident, the moderately long grass surface was wet.
