A take-off was made on the right side of runway 24 as this provided a more even surface. After approximately 300 metres the aircraft had attained a speed of 65 mph when uneven ground caused it to become prematurely airborne. A few feet above the ground the right wing dropped and the aircraft began to turn, catching the wing tip on a wire fence at the edge of the runway. The aircraft veered off the runway and skidded to a standstill with the nosewheel in a hole. The surface wind velocity was  $220^{\circ}/15-25$  kt.
