The pilot was on his first flight on type and was making an approach to land on Runway 21; the weather was good and the surface wind was 220°/10 to 12 kt. The approach was normal until just before touchdown when the pilot retarded the throttle. At that point the right wing dropped and the right wheel contacted the ground; the aircraft rotated through 180° to the right and the right wingtip struck the ground. The pilot stated that the accident resulted from his inexperience on type.
