The pilot reported that he was taking off on Runway 08 at ComptonAbbas for a local area flight. The aircraft became airborne withinapproximately three-quarters of the runway length and as it waspassing over the end of the runway the engine failed. As he wasunable to restart the engine, the pilot decided to land straightahead. After running along the ground for a distance of approximately50 metres the aircraft hit a rock which tipped the aircraftuntil a wing hit the ground. After the impact the wing becamelevel again and the aircraft came to a standstill. No technicaldefect was discovered during the subsequent engineering checks.
