Whilst the aircraft was being taxied onto the runway, the nose landing gear collapsed without warning, causing the propeller to strike the tarmac. The occupants evacuated the aircraft, uninjured.

Examination of the nose landing gear revealed that the downlock hook had failed, allowing the gear to retract. The failure of the hook was by a single overload and was associated with an unauthorised drilled hole in the hook. It appears, from the maintenance records, that the hook may have been inadvertently drilled-through whilst a repair was being done to the nearby nose-gear bay wall, at a time before the aircraft came onto the British register.
