Following a go-around due to circuit congestion, a normal approach was made using full flap. After landing on an undulating area of the grass runway, the aircraft began to porpoise and was observed by the Aerodrome Controller to "wheelbarrow" for some distance before resuming its normal attitude. The pilot was unaware of any damage and continued to his intended shut-down area. Subsequent examination of the aircraft revealed significant damage.
