After a normal approach with the student at the controls, a slight jolt was felt on landing and the left landing gear leg detached. The instructor took control of the aircraft as the left wing tip made contact with the runway. The aircraft came to rest with the left wing on the grass at the edge of the runway.

The maintenance organisation reported that one bolt associated with the left landing gear attachment had fractured in overload and also that the main attachment bolt had "pulled out", stripping its threads. A broken attachment bolt was also found associated with the right landing gear. The maintenance organisation considered that an unreported heavy landing had occurred previously.
