The aircraft was engaged on a familiarisation/training flight which included circuit and landing practice. After rounding out into a flat attitude prior to touching down the handling pilot pushed the control column forward. There was insufficient time for the instructor to correct this control input before the aircraft landed heavily and the nose landing gear collapsed. The handling pilot was experienced on military jet aircraft but was unfamiliar with the characteristics of light aircraft.
