The wind at Stewton was 090°/10 gusting 25 kt and the grass Runway 06, which has an undulating surface, was in use. The surface temperature was 28°C. The takeoff was achieved with full power and the aircraft was rotated at the normal indicated airspeed. However, just as the aircraft became airborne, the pilot was unable to prevent it from veering into some adjacent bushes, which brought it to rest.

The pilot states that the loss of directional control resulted from an unexpected degree of turbulence caused by the sea breeze.
