The student pilot was carrying his second solo flight, which consisted of circuit training on Runway 23 at Wellesbourne Mountford, with a surface wind reported as 240°/8 kt. After four or five successful circuits with touch-and-go landings, the aircraft was approaching for a final full stop landing. The student reported that as a result of a late round out, the nose wheel touched down first, causing a bounce, and the aircraft touched down finally on the main landing gear. The student did not appreciate that any damage had been caused at this time, and taxied the aircraft back to the parking area.
