The student pilot, on his third solo detail, was taking-off on runway 23 when, at about 200 feet agl, he felt a sudden yaw followed immediately by a complete loss of power. He force-landed the aircraft in a field beyond and to the left of the runway, running through a hedge before coming to rest.

Examination of the engine by the maintenance organisation did not reveal any reason for its failure, although the condition of the sparking plugs apparently suggested fuel starvation. A thorough investigation of the fuel system was accordingly carried out with no defects found and it was ascertained that 7 and 9 gallons of fuel remained in the left and right tanks respectively after the accident.
