The aircraft made a main wheel landing on the concrete runway 06 in calm conditions. As the speed reduced the tail was lowered and directional control maintained. As the aircraft continued to slow down a swing to the left occurred and was corrected with right rudder and differential brake. A swing to the right was then experienced and developed into an uncontrollable ground-loop to the right. The left main gear collapsed and the aircraft came to rest on the runway facing the opposite direction to runway 06. Upper torso restraint was being worn and held throughout. There was no fire. It is understood that repair and restoration is to be undertaken.
