After a passenger had disembarked the rotor blades were re-engaged, pre-flight checks carried out, and a lift-off started. On reaching 150 ft, the engine RPM dropped to idle; the collective lever was immediately lowered and autorotation initiated.

As no suitable landing area was available ahead, a 180 degree turn was made to land back on grassland near the take-off site. At the end of the turn insufficient height remained to avoid a hard, cushioned landing, after which the engine was still running, but at ground idle.

A subsequent external examination of the engine did not reveal any damage that was likely to have caused the loss of power. The engine was returned to the manufacturers for investigation.
