Whilst flying at 1200 ft en route to Barton Airfield, Manchester, the engine lost power which was accompanied by a violent vibration. The pilot selected a field and started an approach to land when he noticed a building partially obstructing his landing area. The pilot realigned his approach path to land in a field next to the one he had originally chosen. The touchdown was normal but at the end of the landing roll there was a steep downslope to a drystone wall and a minor road. The left wing tip and undercarriage struck the wall which resulted in the aircraft pivoting anticlockwise, tipping onto its nose and breaking the undercarriage. Subsequent examination of the engine revealed that the crankshaft had failed.
