The instructor was demonstrating hovering flight to his student who had some 6 hours of helicopter flying experience. After about 20 minutes in the designated precision area, the student was given control of the helicopter whilst it was hovering at about 5 feet. It then started to move to the right and the student lowered the collective pitch lever. Before the instructor could counteract this control movement, the right skid contacted the grass and the helicopter rolled over onto its right hand side. The instructor stopped the engine and switched off the electrics before he and his student were able to leave the helicopter through the front left hand windscreen. The diagonal harnesses had restrained both occupants who sustained no injury.
