Following a sudden engine failure at 1,400 feet the pilot chose the only field within gliding distance which did not contain a crop. A 'MAYDAY' call was transmitted and two-way radio communication established until the aircraft passed through 300 feet. When he turned onto finals the pilot realised that the field he was committed to was ploughed. On touchdown the left wheel locked and the aircraft came to rest some 120 yards further on without inverting.

The engine failure was traced to a short circuit between the left (green) and right (white) charging cables at a point where they come together in a harness before entering the electronic ignition units.
