The handling pilot was a PPL holder under training for an IMC rating and he was making a visual approach to the tarmac Runway 21 having completed an ADF tracking to the airfield beacon. Having flared the aircraft for landing, the student pilot allowed the aircraft to sink heavily onto the runway. The instructor took control at a late stage in the landing but was unable to prevent a firm touchdown, as a result of which the aircraft bounced and the nosewheel leg, which had been broken by the impact, detached itself. The instructor landed the aircraft on the grass from the bounce and the nose struck the ground as the speed decreased. Both pilots were uninjured and vacated the aircraft without further incident.
