At the conclusion of a VFR flight from Bourn to Little Gransden, the pilot joined the visual circuit right-hand downwind for Runway 10 and selected the landing gear down as part of the downwind checks. Whilst on the base leg turn he intended to select landing flap but inadvertently selected the landing gear up instead and failed to notice this prior to landing with the wheels up. Because the landing gear on this type of aircraft is semi-retractable the damage done to the aircraft was minimised.
