During the course of a crop dressing task, the helicopter was marshalled in to land by one of the team loaders, whilst another watched the tail rotor. When the aircraft came to rest with the engine running at ground-idle, the main rotor overlapped both the fuel trailer and the hopper trailer, but there was a vertical clearance of 2 feet.

About two minutes later, the ground handler was seen to approach the hopper nearest to the aircraft and lift its 'A' frame into the turning rotor blades. There was a loud bang, the handler was thrown to the ground, and the helicopter started vibrating. The pilot shut down the engine.

The handler had sustained a fractured wrist and a cut on the side of his head. The 'A' frame had been severed from the hopper and the tip of one rotor blade was missing.
