The aircraft was taxiing for departure along a one-way taxi route which passes in front of an airfield hangar. As the aircraft approached the southern corner of the building the pilot realised that he had not fastened the diagonal portion of his safety harness. While reaching behind for the strap, the pilot allowed the left wing to strike the building resulting in distortion of the wing structure.

The pilot reported that the accident was caused by over confidence and a momentary lapse in concentration.
