The aircraft was taking off from a private landing strip at a farm near Aston Somerville, Gloucestershire. The landing strip surface was long wet grass, and the take-off run available was assessed as approximately 420 metres with a pronounced down slope. Shortly after lift off the aircraft's tail section contacted a boundary hedge and it was landed in an adjacent field. In his accident report the pilot records that he failed to consider accurately the effect of long grass to the take-off distance required.

Aeronautical Information Circular 52/1985 includes details of all the recommended factors that should be applied in calculating a light aircraft's take-off performance.
