Having completed a satisfactory dual check, the student pilot was authorised for a session of circuits on a grass runway. The first two circuits and landings were uneventful. Following the third approach, the initial landing resulted in a bounce followed by a float. The second contact with the runway was on an upslope which caused the aircraft to bounce considerably higher than on the first occasion. The pilot attempted a go-around but the aircraft again contacted the runway and the nose landing gear collapsed. After the aircraft had come to rest, the pilot who was uninjured, vacated the aircraft without difficulty.
