Following a normal touchdown and a ground roll of some 30 metres, the aircraft veered to the left and departed the grass runway. After a travelling a further 30 metres, the aircraft came to rest in a ditch. The pilot attributes the accident to momentary hesitation in applying corrective rudder following the crosswind landing.
