The aircraft was being prepared for a scheduled service departure to Toulouse. The cabin crew had boarded the aircraft, but the flight deck crew were not yet on board. A mail vehicle was being manoeuvred between the right wing and the baggage loading conveyor positioned at the rear hold of the aircraft. The driver of the vehicle had previously been working in proximity to a different type of aircraft with greater clearance between the wingtip and the rear hold. He intended to reverse towards the baggage conveyor, but while positioning the vehicle he inadvertently drove too far forward. This caused the front nearside of the vehicle to contact the right aileron trim tab. The aircraft was withdrawn from service until repairs were carried out.
