Headcorn Airfield has grass runways and taxiways. At the end of Runway 29, the taxiway is parallel to the runway and to the boundary fence. Between the fence and the taxiway is a track used extensively by vehicles transporting parachutists.

After a normal landing on Runway 29 the pilot turned left at the end of the runway through 180° to join what he thought was the taxiway. Unfortunately he mistook the vehicle track for the taxiway and, although he realised his mistake, he was too late to prevent the right wing striking a fence post.

The pilot and the CFI of his Biggin Hill based flying club considered that the taxiway markings were poor and that the taxiway was far less conspicuous than the vehicle track.
