The pilot landed by a bowser parked on the shore of Loch Fyne, where the wind was light and variable, to execute a rotors running refuel. At touchdown a windsock mounted on the bowser was flying away from the aircraft (i.e. the helicopter was upwind of the windsock). The aircraft's throttle was retarded to flight idle and shortly afterwards the windsock changed direction through approximately 180°. One of the main rotor blades struck the fabric of the windsock which dragged its mounting pole into the rotor disc. The resultant impact cracked one of the rotor blade tips and the blade had to be replaced.
