The student pilot and his instructor intended to perform a "touch and go" landing on Runway 26 at Aldergrove aerodrome. The landing was apparently normal, but as the flaps were retracted to the take-off setting, the port wing sank to the ground as the port main undercarriage collapsed.

Some brake application was used by the instructor to prevent a violent swing to port and to keep the aircraft on the runway.

Subsequent inspection revealed that the port undercarriage torque link top attachment lugs had failed. Further information on this failure can be found in the Civil Aviation Authority's General Aviation Safety Information Leaflet Number 10/85.
