The aircraft was carrying out a full flap landing in light wind conditions on a grass runway. The runway length was 610 metres, of which 502 metres were declared as the landing distance available. A road bordered by hedges crossed the extended runway centreline at the airfield boundary. The aircraft touched down late and, fearing that he might not be able to stop in the absence of headwind, the pilot attempted to raise the flaps and go around. The landing gear caught the first hedge and the aircraft collided with the second hedge before coming to rest some 30 to 40 metres beyond the road.
