The aircraft was being taxied to the threshold of runway 24 when the pilot noticed that directional control was becoming difficult, the left wing dipped and the left main gear partially collapsed.




Figure 1 Main Leg Assembly

The main gear oleo is held in the yoke by a steel rod, which itself is retained by a pin, locked by a screw. The assembly is shown in Figure 1. The pin was missing and the oleo had been released.

Some ten days prior to the incident the aircraft was subjected to a heavy landing, it is thought by the pilot that the landing had stressed the assembly, allowing the pin to drop out.
