The pilot landed on Runway 27 at Sturgate in fine weather and light wind conditions. After an apparently satisfactory three-point landing the aircraft began to swing to the left. Being aware of the possibility of a ground loop and with plenty of room to spare, the pilot decided to take off and complete another circuit to land. As he applied full power, the engine torque exacerbated the swing to the left whereupon the spoked right mainwheel collapsed, the axle dropped to the runway surface and the aircraft tipped over onto its nose.
