The student pilot was conducting a session of solo circuit flying onto the grass Runway 26 at Compton Abbas; the wind was reported as being westerly at 5 kt. The pilot reported that he ballooned during the hold off and became too high. He therefore pushed the control column forward to lower the nose in an attempt to correct the situation. The aircraft touched down nosewheel first, and the nose leg collapsed.

There was no fire, and the pilot vacated the aircraft by the normal means. He was wearing a full harness and sustained only minor injuries.
