The pilot in the left-hand seat, who had a total of 47 hours flying experience, was converting to type under the supervision of the commander who occupied the right-hand seat. The aircraft was fitted with dual controls with the exception of brake pedals which were fitted only to the left-hand seat position. The weather was fine and the wind was southerly at 5 kt.

On the second approach to Runway 26 the aircraft touched down in a three point attitude but bounced very slightly. The bounce did not warrant a go-around but after the second touchdown the aircraft began to swing to the left. The commander took control and applied full right rudder but this was ineffective so he asked the trainee to apply right wheelbrake. The trainee did so but too harshly and the aircraft swung rapidly to the right resulting in a vicious ground loop during which the left main gear leg collapsed.
