During the landing roll, at about 30 kt, the right main landing gear leg collapsed. The aircraft came to rest just off the right side of the runway. There was no fire and the pilot exited the aircraft in the normal manner.

Subsequent examination showed that landing gear uplock strut had broken and disabled the downlock mechanism.
