After take off from Runway 18, as the pilot initiated a climbing turn to the left at about 100 feet agl, the engine lost power and ran down to idle speed. The pilot elected to attempt a forced landing on Runway 27, but during this attempt the aircraft stalled. However he was able to effect a partial recovery before the aircraft struck the ground in a flat attitude, some 25 feet short of the runway threshold.

A limited post accident examination of the engine by the insurance assessor failed to identify any evidence as to the cause of the loss of power. However, a fuel or ignition problem was considered to be the most probable explanation.
