After a flight from Compton Abbas the pilot reports that he made an approach for landing on the grass runway 30 at Gransden airfield. The threshold of this runway is close to a line of trees and a house. As the aircraft descended past the trees some turbulence was encountered and a high sink rate resulted in a firm landing in the undershoot area. The nose landing gear collapsed and the aircraft slid to a halt when both occupants were able to vacate the aircraft without injury.

The surface wind at the time was 280/10 to 15 knots, and the pilot considers that the close proximity of the trees to the runway threshold probably caused some low level wind shear. Since this accident the owner of the airfield has seeded another grass runway further away from any obstructions.
