The landing flare was initiated late and the aircraft over-rotated resulting in an excessive float before touchdown. During this float the wind, which was reported as variable between 360° and 020° at 8 kt, is thought to have backed to the crosswind direction and the aircraft stalled onto Runway 08 from a height of about 7 feet.
