The aircraft was being flown from Old Sarum airfield to the grass strip at Pepperbox field, Coombe Down, 4 nm SW of Salisbury, Wiltshire. The weather at the time was fine with a surface wind of 240°/10 kt, although there had been heavy rain the previous day.

After a normal landing and at slow speed the aircraft drifted to the left of the strip allowing the left wheel to enter an area of ploughed soil. The aircraft slewed to the left still further and overturned. The pilot, who was wearing a full harness, vacated the aircraft without injury.

The pilot reported that the cause of the accident was due to the very wet and soft grass conditions leading to directional control problems during the landing run.
