During an otherwise uneventful flight from Skegness to Temple Bruer, whilst cruising at 1600 feet, the engine began to lose power. Attempts to rectify this problem were unsuccessful and a forced landing was made in a field. Because the ground was soft and wet, in the last few seconds of the landing roll the port wheel sank into the ground, breaking the port main landing gear leg.

There was no fire and the pilot was wearing a diagonal upper torso restraint which held on impact.

Subsequent investigation has revealed no reason for the engine failure but it is noted that the ambient air temperature was within the range which might suggest carburettor icing.
