The aircraft was in use for circuit training and practice engine failures. Two normal circuits and touch-and-go landings had been flown when, on the third take-off, the instructor closed the throttle at a height of about 30 feet. The student abruptly lowered the nose and the instructor had insufficient time to correct the aircraft's attitude before it struck the ground in a pitch attitude of about 20° nose down. The nose dug into the soft surface and ploughed a furrow before the aircraft bounced slightly. The tail rose to the near vertical before the second impact but fell back again allowing the aircraft to come to rest in a normal attitude. Both occupants were wearing full safety harnesses which held on impact.
